# The Hospitality of Abraham by Angelos Akotantos, 14th Century

This icon depicts the story of Sarah and Abraham hosting three guests by the Oak of Mamre (Genesis 18). These three strangers, who turn out to be the presence of God, announce good news about God's faithfulness to the forebears of Israel. This story has been interpreted as a call to extend radical hospitality to all strangers who are in our midst. After all, as the writer of Hebrews says, we may be "entertaining angels unawares" (Hebrews 13).

## Welcome Guest Musicians

TONIA HUGHES KENDRICK is notably among Minnesota's most gifted artists, acclaimed for her transparent delivery that leaves audiences with a poignant electricity. Being ever willing to take on a challenge, and having an openness to engage in culturally diverse, what she calls "unusual" collaborations, has catapulted her career. Fusing her rich gospel background with the folk singing of Larry Long or the world-class trumpeting of Charles Lazarus with the Minnesota Orchestra or with a Flamenco at The Lab Theater defies categorization and is a further testament of her genre-bending talent.

With five CD recordings under her belt, Tonia is an unstoppable musical force challenging audiences from churches to theaters to concert halls to stretch beyond perceived musical limitations and embrace the beauty of coming together: one heart at a time, one note at a time.

KENNETH VIGNE is an organist and composer based in Minneapolis, Minnesota, and currently serves as the Associate Director of Music at Westminster Presbyterian Church. Kenneth passionately advocates for diversity and representation in the arts, believing that all find spirituality in music should be able to find it in songs that they consider their own. He is a gifted improviser on both piano and

organ and uses his gifts to find connections with local artists. He has collaborated with spoken word artists, gospel singers, dancers, poets, playwrights, storytellers, choreographers, among others to create multidisciplinary works that connect communities and artforms together. He challenges himself to say "yes" to the creative nudging of the Holy Spirit. Kenneth lives with his wife and two children in Saint Louis Park.
