The Hospitality of Abraham by Angelos Akotantos, 14th Century

This icon depicts the story of Sarah and Abraham hosting three guests by the Oak of Mamre (Genesis 18). These three strangers, who turn out to be the presence of God, announce good news about God's faithfulness to the forebears of Israel. This story has been interpreted as a call to extend radical hospitality to all strangers who are in our midst. After all, as the writer of Hebrews says, we may be "entertaining angels unawares" (Hebrews 13).

Paul Damico-Carper is a church musician, worship leader, tech director, composer, and multi-instrumentalist. He recently served as Assistant Director of Music and Worship Production at Gloria Dei Lutheran Church, St. Paul, where he developed a worship production ministry in response to the Covid pandemic. In 2020, he received the Brugh Emerging Leader Award from the Institute of Liturgical Studies (Valparaiso University). He serves on the editorial board of CrossAccent (the journal of the Association of Lutheran Church Musicians) and has been a core member of the worship band at ELCA Churchwide assemblies for the last decade.

Paul holds degrees in music (B.A., Valparaiso University) and theology (M.A.T.S., Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago). He loves spending time with his family, cooking, playing fiddle with friends, and walking the family's dogs along the banks of the Mississippi River.
