# **Music Opportunities This Fall**

The new program year will soon be upon us! If you enjoy music and want to explore opportunities to sing or play instruments as part of our music ministry, consider:

- CENTRAL CHOIR: An adult choir that sings in worship most weeks, September-May with rehearsals on Wednesdays at 7:15 p.m.
- BELL ENSEMBLE: An ensemble for adults and high school youth with music-reading experience. Explore sounds and timbres and play an interesting bell repertoire. Rehearsals are Wednesdays at 6:00 p.m.

- CHAMBER ENSEMBLE: Open to adult and youth instrumentalists (grade 8 and up) who have played for at least three years. Rehearses on Sundays after worship when needed.
- STICKS & STEEL PERCUSSION: Open to elementary age children to discover hand chimes, bells, marimba, hand drums, and other percussion during Sunday Connection time.
