

Welcome Rev. David Stewart

Born a SoCal beachboy, Rev. David Stewart became a Minnesotan in 1985 when he accepted a call to Dayton Avenue Presbyterian Church (DAPC), moving from Pendleton, Oregon, where he served three churches for ten years. With family in tow – Spouse Elona Street-Stewart, daughter Shekinah, and sons Clinton and Deacon, they settled into the Summit-University neighborhood they still call home, welcoming Cole in 1987. They have four grandchildren living in the East Metro and one in Poncha Springs, CO.

David completed his tenure at DAPC on December 31, 2015 and now ministers in the community through a youth outreach nonprofit he helped form - Transforming NextGen - and teaching Tai Ji Quan – Moving for Better Balance to seniors. His partner in ministry, Elona, has served the Synod of Lakes and Prairies for over thirty years, currently as Synod Executive.

Welcome Artist-in-Residence Paul Damico-Carper

Paul Damico-Carper is a church musician, worship leader, tech director, composer, and multi-instrumentalist. He recently served as Assistant Director of Music and Worship Production at Gloria Dei Lutheran Church, St. Paul, MN, where he developed a worship production ministry in response to the Covid-19 pandemic. With his wife Elizabeth, he directed and led a daily livestream devotional ministry for the first year of the pandemic on Facebook called the "Community Video Hymn Sing."

In 2020, Paul received the Brugh Emerging Leader Award from the Institute of Liturgical Studies (Valparaiso University). He serves on the editorial board of *CrossAccent* (the journal of the Association of Lutheran Church Musicians) and has been a core member of the worship band at ELCA Churchwide assemblies for the last decade.

Paul holds degrees in music (B.A. '04, Valparaiso University) and theology (M.A.T.S. '11, Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago) and was shaped by life in community at Holden Village.

He loves spending time with his family, cooking, playing fiddle with friends, and walking the family's dogs along the banks of the Mississippi River.

Welcome Dancers of the CREO Arts & Dance Conservatory

Today we welcome CREO Arts & Dance Conservatory to worship. Last February, older dancers from the VERVE Dance Company joined us. This time, it is the younger dancers sharing their dance ministry.

At the heart of CREO is the fusion of Christian faith and movement. The conservatory teaches dancers to improvise in the spirit, explore their faith through Biblical understanding and deductive reasoning, and express the message of Gospel through performance.

Did You Know?

When it was built, like most other buildings, Central Presbyterian Church was heated with coal, supplemented by five fireplaces. Coal was delivered weekly to the north side of the building and shoveled into the coal room in the sub-basement.

The openings to the coal shuts are still visible. They look like blocked-up windows in the limestone foundation. In the subbasement, on the east side at the base of the chimney, there is an opening to empty the ashes from the fireplaces. From there, the ashes were taken to an ash pit that is under the alley that is between the church and St. Louis Church. The fireplaces are still in place but no longer functional.

In the early 20th century, the church converted to oil heating. A very large oil tank was installed in the sub-basement on the north side. This tank can still be seen behind a wall because it was too big to be removed without cutting it up into pieces. It was emptied of oil and filled with a substance to make it safe.

In the later part of the 20th century the church converted to hot water heat. St. Paul pioneered a city-wide hot water heating system, and our church was one of the first customers. Each customer is charged a monthly fee to maintain the system in place and be ready when needed. When the heat is turned on, an additional fee based on amount of use is charged.
