Schubert Club Concert: Songs of the Season

FEATURING CAROLS BY MINNESOTA COMPOSERS

Thurs., Dec. 16 - Noon & 7:00 p.m.

Again this year, due to audience demand, Schubert Club is expanding to add a second performance at our own historic Central Presbyterian Church. The concert is free and open to the public.

Named "the most imaginative classical holiday program" by the Star Tribune, and performed to overflow audiences for the past seven years, The Schubert Club's annual "Songs of the Season" program features winter songs and carols by more than a dozen Minnesota composers and songwriters. This year's program is curated by Central's Composer-in-Residence Abbie Betinis with special guests, including Central Choir as a guest performer!

Composer Abbie Betinis writes music called "inventive, richly melodic" (The New York Times), "superb, whirling, soaring" (Tacoma News Tribune),



and "the highlight" of the program (Boston Globe). With over 50 commissioned works for ensembles, Abbie is also a two-time McKnight Artist Fellow, and at age 31, was listed in NPR Music's Top 100 Composers Under 40. Abbie has been a Composer-in-Residence with New York State School Music Association, The Rose Ensemble, The Singers-Minnesota Choral Artists, and Schubert Club.

Originally from Wisconsin, Abbie is a graduate of St. Olaf College (B.A.), the University of Minnesota (M.A.), and holds a diplôme from the European American Musical Alliance Institute in Paris, France. She lives in Minnesota, where she is Adjunct Professor of Composition at Concordia University-St Paul and executive director of Justice Choir.

CHRISTMAS BOOKS FOR ANTI-RACISM

Anti-Racism never takes a holiday! In this holiday season, consider sharing your convictions gently by gifting a book that lifts up the work of an artist of color. These suggestions are just a few of the treasures I have gathered over the years. They are all sold in the children's section of the bookstore and make perfect gifts for children of all ages!

O Holy Night: Christmas with the Boys Choir of Harlem combines the choir's recording of traditional carols with their texts illustrated by the paintings of Faith Ringgold. Ms. Ringgold is best known for her artistic activism and her story quilts. Her life bridges the years between the Harlem Renaissance and the recent work of Bisa Butler, whose remarkable quilted portraits convey the joy of Black life in the United States. New York: HarperCollins, 2004.

Christmas Moccasins is written and illustrated by Ray Buckley, who is of Lakota/Tlingit/Scots descent. The story is one of love, forgiveness, and the freedom that comes from practicing both. A young boy and his grandmother deliver some very special Christmas gifts to some young men whose previous cruelty would seem to preclude the story's ending. Nashville: Abington Press, 2003.

Amazing Peace is prominent Black poet Maya Angelou's Christmas poem, which she read at the lighting of the National Christmas Tree in Washington, D.C., in 2005. A recording of the event, with its inclusive holiday spirit of peace, is accompanied by the paint and fabric artistry of Steve Johnson and Lou Fancher, a white couple from the Pacific Northwest who have collaborated on many picture books. New York: Random House Schwartz and Wade Books, 2005.

Not a Christmas text, but certainly a message of peace to a world torn apart by chaos, Old Turtle is one of my all-time favorites. Prints of two of the water-color illustrations hang in my home. They are the work of Cheng-Khee Chee, who has worked throughout the United States and China, and who is an Associate Professor at the University of Minnesota, Duluth. Douglas Wood, who penned the text, is an author, poet, and musician who lives in a cabin in the Minnesota woods (and must be white, because no one ever says otherwise!) Duluth, MN: Pfeifer-Hamilton Publishers, 1992.

And of course, Birchbark House by Ojibwe author Louise Erdrich would also make a wonderful gift! Our intergenerational read has been rescheduled to begin in January because of delays in publishing. Email office@centralforgood.org if you want to order a copy through the church.

To those with young children who want to participate in the day's activities, childcare will be available in the nursery for an hour during decorating, from 11:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.



SESSION UPDATE

Central is proceeding with the search for a permanent pastor. November, we reviewed and approved the Mission Study report prepared based on the discussion groups held earlier this summer. This report has now been sent to the Presbytery for review and approval. Once we get word back from the Presbytery that we have done our initial work, we are ready to move forward on forming a Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC). read the Mission study, go to www.centralforgood.org/pastor.

All church members were invited to attend an informational meeting with Rev. Gale Robb, Acting Presbytery Executive Presbyter and Diane Smith, our Presbytery liaison. Seven Central members attended. Another information meeting will occur during the next few weeks. Watch the

eConnect and the bulletin for date and time to learn about the process and decide if you are interested in serving on the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC). Please attend. The church needs a diverse membership for the PNC to locate a pastor who will serve all our members and lead us.

The Advent Season will begin early this year - the first Sunday of Advent is November 28. We will celebrate the season with the lighting of the Advent wreath every Sunday. Decorating the church will be Saturday, December 11. Please sign up at www.centralforgood.org/ volunteer if you would enjoy decorating for Christmas. children's pageant (always fun) will be on Sunday, December 12. And the big climax of Advent is Christmas with two services on December 24.

We are moving forward with developing the 2022 budget. Challenges this year are increases in the basic expenses (utilities, repairs, etc.) along with updating and replacing mechanical systems in the building. In November, we approved necessary upgrades in our security system. The third part of our budget is personnel - so important in serving our present members, expanding our membership. The unknown part of the budget is our anticipated income - which depends on our members making an increased pledge for 2022 - and then keeping it.

This Year's Advent: The Jesse Tree

In December, we anticipate the Christmas holiday and the joy of time spent with loved ones. As followers of Christ, we also anticipate the season of Advent - a time to reflect on the promised Messiah, Jesus, born in Bethlehem - our Lord who is coming again. This year, we invite you to join our Children's and Youth ministry as we pilgrimage through the Bible using paper Jesse Tree ornaments.

Here's how the Jesse Tree works: each day of Advent, read a short Bible story about someone on Jesus's family tree and hang an ornament symbolizing the story on your Jesse Tree (which can be branches brought in from a tree or shrub or just the ornaments, taped to your wall in the shape of an evergreen). As you hang the ornaments, witness the beautiful faithfulness of God through generations and the meaning of Jesus' birth.


