SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 2

SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 23

The final Sunday before the season of Lent takes us up on the mountaintop with Jesus. In a story that is called the Transfiguration, the gospels tell of Jesus being suddenly highlighted, changed, clarified for the disciples who have joined him for prayer. How do we experience clarity of purpose and other mountaintop moments? Rev. Colby will preach with Central Choir singing and music by the Ars Nova Brass Quintet.

SPECIAL OPPORTUNITY TO SING IN WORLD PREMIERE


Be a part of a special opportunity to sing a world-premiere and be in a recording of To Know the Path by composer Linda Kachelmeier.


DRUM MAJOR INSTINCT

ABOUT CARTHAGE TREBLE CHOIR

Carthage Treble Choir is a group of 50-60 women who sing music from all genres of choral music for female voices. It has recently appeared at WMEA, and NCACDA and performs on and off campus. The group tours regionally, nationally, and internationally including Central Europe and China.

ABOUT IBUKA DANCE

Ibuka Dance Foundation is a Tanzanian not-for-profit organization founded in Arusha, Tanzania in 2014 by Canadian dancer, pedagogue and choreographer Anna Bussey. During several visits to Tanzania, Bussey met and created with refreshingly inspired dancers who were open, talented and ready to go places with their art form, yet with no infrastructure and few opportunities available to them.

Ibuka was launched to address these issues, first by building a studio to provide a physical space in Arusha dedicated to dance, second by starting a scholarship training program for Tanzanian youth to become professional dancers, and lastly, by creating innovative afrocontemporary dance works and







performing locally, nationally and internationally.

Ibuka's mission is to educate and employ disadvantaged youth with a focus on empowering girls & young women in Tanzania.


