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THE SEASON OF LENT IN 2021 Praying the Psalms

Show me your ways, Lord, teach me your paths. [Psalm 25]

Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable to you, O Lord, my rock and my redeemer. [Psalm 19]

Create in me a clean heart, O God, and put a new and right spirit within me. Do not cast me away from your presence, and do not take your holy spirit from me. Restore to me the joy of your salvation, and sustain in me a willing spirit. [Psalm 51]

Thomas Merton wrote, "The Psalms are not only the songs of prophets inspired by God, they are the songs of the whole Church, the very expression of her deepest inner life. The words and thoughts of the Psalms spring not only from the unsearchable depths of God, but also from the inmost heart of the Church, and there are no songs which better express her soul, her desires, her longing, her sorrows and her joys."

As our own church finds itself in a time of transition and introspection, we can look to the Psalms as so many have done for generations before us. The beauty and the rawness of the words might give voice to what we are feeling right now as well. We will welcome several guest speakers in worship to begin this Lenten series on the Psalms, including two members of Central's program staff.



shampoo, conditioner, bar soap


• Babies - diapers, baby wipes






VOCALPOINT
