

BUILDING CONSTRUCTION PROJECT

One of the recommendations from the assessment of the condition of the external fabric of the building will be moving forward in January.

The historic preservation architect hired by Central gave a high priority recommendation for a drain tile project to address water leakage. We have not had standing water but it is evident that there is moisture seeping through the limestone foundation and at times up through the concrete floor. (You can see where the floor is darker when it is moist). We have consulted a civil engineering firm that has drawn up a sample plan that is the basis for this project.

The drain tile project is scheduled to last three days from January 20-23 and will involve jackhammering to dig a trench along the inside of the outer wall in three locations:

- 1. The basement storage rooms behind the choir room through to the pantry.
- 2. The basement fire escape stairs along the wall in the shop that is parallel to the drive between the church and St. Louis.
- 3. In the sub-basement.

This work will be dirty, dusty and very loud.

Once the trenches are opened, we will have a plumber hook up the sump pumps to new piping that will drain outside into the downspouts.

Because we want to get this done before snowmelt and another wet spring, the church is paying for this separately from the grant project work we hope will commence in the later spring. We should hear whether our grant proposal is accepted by the end of this month.


