


Eight Bible Stories You Need to Know

FROM REV. CHATELAINE-SAMSEN

We're already halfway through a summer sermon series on what I believe are eight Bible stories you need to know. These eight stories span the Bible from beginning to end, marking critical milestones in the stories of Israel and of the followers of Jesus.

Why does it matter that we know these stories? Some of my favorite memories are of stories shared by family members, especially grandparents. Stories of ancestors coming to America. Stories about the things we still laugh about. Stories about making commitments and facing consequences. Stories about the big stuff and the little stuff, all shaping my understanding of the world and who I am in it.

That's why we tell important stories over and over again. Those stories, even when they're about other people, are about us. They orient us to our place and purpose. So when we share stories from Scripture, we're



sharing those stories that have formed generations of people into a common and complex faith. They matter to us because, even if we don't realize it, they have formed who we are, what we believe, and where we're going. And, as it turns out, they tell the story of a God who has always had it in mind to love and care for the whole of creation.

I hope you find some good storytelling time this summer.

Maybe over a campfire, or with some friends and family over for a weekend. Listen and tell those stories with an ear towards why they matter and how they've made you who you are. And may you notice that, sometimes obviously and sometimes quietly, that God has been there in those stories all along.

# Beacon Celebrates Exciting Accomplishments!

The past couple months have been a very active time for Central's mission for housing justice and we thank you for your support and engagement in the work to drive change.

#### Legislature Responds

The Beacon Leadership Team at Central is celebrating major accomplishments at the State Legislature this year with the entire Beacon Interfaith Housing Collaborative network.

Bring It Home, Minnesota passed, creating 5,500 new rent vouchers for Minnesota families with low incomes. There are many more who need this help, but this is a fantastic start to an idea which began four years ago – a solid foundation to build on in future legislative sessions.

Overall, the Minnesota Legislature dramatically increased investment in housing, which has historically been a low percentage in the overall State budget. Included was \$200 million dollars to build new affordable housing – and \$25 million for a new "strengthen supportive housing program" that will fill currently unfunded but necessary elements to supportive housing like front desk and security personnel.

Thanks to everyone who joined in advocating for new laws and appropriations. You helped by sending emails; calling elected officials; attending hearings and rallies; and praying for justice.



### Keys to Unlock the Metro

Thank you as well to everyone who helped out with the Beacon "Keys" collection and activity this past month. Together, 688 keys were collected and tagged with messages to the Met Council to unlock the metro to deeply affordable housing. Central's Beacon team is especially joyful that many of you joined in housing advocacy for the first time! (See next page for pictures from that event.)

On June 14, 40 people from across the Beacon Interfaith Collaborative gathered at Central. Our keys combined with other churches totaling over 1000 - representing a portion of the affordable apartment homes that need to be built in the suburbs of the wider Metro. They cannot be built unless the Metropolitan Council creates a

consistent policy for providing project -based vouchers for deeply affordable housing development.

After rehearsing songs of justice in our sanctuary, Pastor Chris blessed us and sent us on our march to a meeting of the Met Council. There, we presented the keys and Rev. Elijah McDavid spoke to the full Council on our behalf.

#### Moving Forward

This summer, we will still be working hard, especially in following up with the Met Council to "Unlock the Metro" and create a policy of more project-based rental vouchers. This can have a huge impact on growing affordable housing in the suburbs, including Beacon's new development in Maplewood - Gladstone Crossing - which will bring 40 units of low-income housing to support families like those served by Project Home.

# Sanctuary Choir Coming to Central

Central Presbyterian Church is pleased to welcome the Sanctuary Choir from the First Presbyterian Church of Davenport, Iowa to worship on Sunday, July 30.

A premiere adult church choir in the Midwest, the Sanctuary Choir offers a variety of great choral music with an 85-member ensemble. The choir has a rich history of providing great music in the Quad Cities, having been featured for over two decades as part of the Quad City Symphony Orchestra's Holiday Pops concerts and twice on national PBS-TV.

The Sanctuary Choir has commissioned and premiered a number of choral works and arrangements, including anthems by such renowned composers as William Mathias, Howard Helvey, John Gere, Gary Fry, Stephen Mager, Jay Flood, and Mack Wilberg; building on the choir's commitment to creating new music, featuring a new commission by renowned British composer Jonathan Dove.

The choir has also worked with such distinguished composers and conductors as Jester Hairston,
Andrew Carter, and Dale Warland.
In the summer of 2018, the choir made its first international tour with a music outreach trip to Germany, and plans to return to Europe in 2021 with a tour of Ireland.
