Community Event Against Gun Violence

Mark Your Calendar

On Saturday, October 14, Central will be hosting an event of Lament and Hope in the face of the epidemic of gun violence in our community and beyond.

We're inviting members of Central and partners across the community to stand together as we honor the work of those who stand for non-violence and reform, and lament the grievous injury that gun violence does to those – all humans – made in God's sacred image.

During the time we gather – from 10 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. – we'll have an opportunity to memorialize our neighbors lost to gun violence over the past few years, hear testimony from members of the community, and reflect on how our common faith urges us towards a more just and peaceful future. Included will be an outdoor temporary memorial, presence from community partners, and a striking visual representation of the work we are called to blacksmiths transforming the disassembled pieces of firearms into garden tools, a reminder of the

Biblical call to transform our tools of violence into tools of life.

Reflections from the Anti-Racism Task Force

The Central Presbyterian Anti-Racism Task Force is back! The group retreated for a few months to take another thorough and reflective look at its work, to plot a sustainable future, and to develop some recommendations for moving forward. Effective anti-racism effort involves breaking down old systems and replacing them with new ones. It involves getting to the roots of problems that appear on the surface. It involves speaking truth to power in a world that over-values white, upper class, educated males with expertise. It involves both self-awareness and action at a governance level. CPC members and friends already knew all of these things, of course, and so did we - in our heads!

Where to Begin?

The reality of actually doing the work, however, leaves our task force acutely aware of the enormity of racism. A housing task force can focus on learning about and addressing housing issues. A hunger task force can focus on learning about and addressing hunger issues. These major projects are essential to moving toward justice. In the face of overlapping priorities, they can also provide a central focus. But an Anti-Racism task force? Dealing with the effects of white supremacy and remaking the world into an image a little closer to God's intent? How on earth can anyone organize that goal into manageable tasks?

ARTF's three years together as a task force have taught us very clearly that a small group of dedicated people can make a huge difference within ourselves in every area of anti-racism. We are not the same people we were when we began this work together. And maybe that's the point. Maybe taking on the monumental task of addressing racism will require every willing person, working together and in every corner of the world they occupy, to have a deep and far -reaching effect. There are not enough seats in the meeting room for everyone who is needed to get the work done!

Steering a Course

The Anti-Racism Task Force is going to keep working out our own faith commitments to becoming anti-racist – our own understanding of racism and the ways we participate in it, our own awareness of the pervasive and intersectional nature of racism, our own commitments to countering racism with love and justice. We will keep each other accountable. We need, after all, to practice what we are going to preach!

Then, we are going to provide leadership for a cooperative effort with others in the congregation who see a need for robust and deeply intentional adult spiritual formation. We have an ulterior motive! We want that the adult spiritual

formation in which Central engages to have an anti-racist lens. ARTF commits to using the next three years to lead the congregation in planning and implementing a unified, active program that will prepare adults in our congregation and community to address issues of injustice within and beyond ourselves by:

- developing solid Biblical knowledge and the ability to articulate biblical principles in considering current issues;
- developing skills for meeting disagreement and resistance calmly, articulately, and respectfully;
- prioritizing becoming everyday allies of the vulnerable in our community;
- embracing vulnerability in ourselves, while supporting each other in working toward God's peace, love, and justice.

The shift is both slight and significant. We will continue to work against racism and for justice. We will also work to support members and friends of Central church in building cultures and practices of anti-racism.

HELP PREPARE LUNCH

Each Wednesday, volunteers work alongside Chef Barb Westman to prepare and serve a catered meal for guests from the surrounding community. Central Closet also distributes clothing at no cost to our guests in need.

SERVE HOUSING NEEDS

Along with our other service and justice projects, our Beacon Interfaith Housing team works to advocate and provide housing for low-income people around the metro area.

WORK FOR ANTI-RACISM

Our Anti-Racism Task Force resources the congregation and our community to advocate for justice and do the hard work of turning away from systemic racism.

Sharing Music

CENTRAL CHOIR

This SATB adult choir sings in worship weekly from September -May. While reading music isn't required, this choir moves quickly, learns a lot of repertoire, and throughout the year sings some challenging music. Rehearsals are Wednesdays at 7:15 p.m.

HANDBELL ENSEMBLE

This is an ensemble for adults and high school youth with music-reading experience. This group experiments with sounds and timbres, playing an interesting bell repertoire. Rehearsals are Wednesdays at 6:00 p.m.

CHAMBER ENSEMBLE

Open to adults and youth (grade 8 and up) who have played traditional band/orchestra instruments for at least three years. We rehearse on Sundays as necessary at 11:45 a.m. for about 30 minutes and play in worship every-other-month or so. First rehearsal is October 15.


CABARET
